| 107 | <p><u><b>DOGS TRAINED TO LEAD THE BLIND/TO DETECT EXPLOSIVES/TO ASSIST THE DEAF/FOR SEARCH AND RESCUE</b></u></p> <p>(A) Dogs, as described below, will not be carried unless proper permits are obtained for entry into the country or territory of destination and countries or territories of transit where such permits are required and only if the evidence of possession of such permits is presented prior to reservations being made. If any country or territory on the route prohibits the entry of dogs, carriage will be refused. It should be understood also that under certain operating conditions such as long nonstop flights or on certain types of aircraft it is impracticable to carry a dog in the passenger compartments and under such conditions carriage will be refused.</p> <p>(B) Carrier accepts for transportation, without charge, a dog trained to lead the blind, properly harnessed, when it accompanies a passenger with impaired vision dependent upon such dog. The dog will be permitted to accompany such passenger into the cabin, but will not be permitted to occupy a seat.</p> <p>(C) Carrier accepts for transportation, without charge, a dog, properly harnessed, trained to assist the deaf, when it accompanies a passenger with impaired hearing dependent upon such dog. The dog will be permitted to accompany such passenger into the cabin, but will not be permitted to occupy a seat.</p> |
