RULE	SECTION I - GENERAL RULES
110	<p><b>CHECKED AND CARRY-ON BAGGAGE</b></p> <p>Subject to the conditions of Rules 97 (ACCEPTANCE OF BAGGAGE), 100 (CONDITIONS AND CHARGES FOR ACCEPTANCE OF SPECIAL ITEMS), 105 (ANIMALS) and 107 (DOGS TRAINED TO LEAD THE BLIND/TO DETECT EXPLOSIVES/TO ASSIST THE DEAF/FOR SEARCH AND RESCUE), passengers may check baggage for carriage in the cargo compartment of the aircraft and/or may carry baggage on board the aircraft subject to the provisions in paragraphs (A) and (B) below. The suitability of baggage, as to weight, size and character, to be carried in the passenger compartment of the aircraft will be determined by the carrier.</p> <p>(A) <b>CHECKED BAGGAGE</b> Carrier will check baggage which is tendered by a passenger and which is acceptable under the terms of Rules 97 (ACCEPTANCE OF BAGGAGE), 100 (CONDITIONS AND CHARGES FOR ACCEPTANCE OF SPECIAL ITEMS), 105 (ANIMALS) and 107 (DOGS TRAINED TO LEAD THE BLIND/TO DETECT EXPLOSIVES/TO ASSIST THE DEAF/FOR SEARCH AND RESCUE), upon presentation by a passenger of a valid ticket for transportation over the lines of that carrier, subject to the conditions specified below:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) Baggage must be checked at the city or airport office designated by the carrier and in advance of flight departure time as prescribed by the carrier.</li> <li>(2) The passenger's name must appear on the baggage. Carrier will supply baggage identification labels free of charge.</li> <li>(3) Baggage will not be checked: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) to a point that is not specified on the passenger's ticket.</li> <li>(b) beyond the passenger's next point of stopover or, if there is no stopover, beyond the destination designated on the ticket.</li> <li>(c) beyond a point at which the passenger wants to reclaim the baggage or any portion thereof.</li> <li>(d) beyond the point to which all applicable charges have been paid.</li> <li>(e) beyond a point at which the passenger is to transfer to a connecting flight, if that flight is scheduled to depart from an airport different from the one at which the passenger is scheduled to arrive.</li> <li>(f) Beyond the point to which the passenger holds a reservation.</li> </ol> </li> <li>(4) Live animals will not be checked beyond a point of transfer to another carrier.</li> <li>†(N)(5) Journeys originating/terminating in Tonga, Independent Samoa and Vanuatu: Air Pacific reserves the right to refuse baggage exceeding the free baggage allowance as specified in Rule 114.</li> </ol> <p>(B) <b>CARRY-ON BAGGAGE</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) When baggage is carried on board the aircraft it may be stored in carry-on compartments of aircraft so equipped or it must be retained in the passenger's custody and stored under a seat or in an overhead compartment approved for the carriage of such baggage.</li> <li>(2) <u>Maximum Dimensions for Under Seat Storage</u> Carrier will accept a maximum of two bags whose sum of the outside linear dimensions does not exceed 45 inches.</li> </ol>
