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RULE	SECTION I - GENERAL RULES
112	<p><b>CABIN-SEAT BAGGAGE AND CHARGES</b></p> <p>When a passenger requests that an item of baggage be carried in the cabin and it is determined by the carrier that the item is acceptable as cabin baggage but it is so fragile and/or bulky as to require the use of a seat(s), the provisions specified below will apply:</p> <p>Cabin-seat baggage must be carried aboard the aircraft by the passenger and secured in a seat.</p> <p>(A) For FJ, the seat must be located in the aircraft as indicated below:          POSITION          (1) Such baggage must be carried in the first row of seats immediately after fixed bulkheads.          (2) Passenger and baggage must occupy the same compartment.</p> <p>(B) <b>CHARGES</b>          Carrier will charge 100 percent of the applicable full fare for that portion of the trip on which the extra seat is used. The cabin-seat baggage will not be included in determining the free baggage allowance or excess baggage charges.</p> <p>(C) In no event will more than 165 pounds (75 kilograms) of baggage per seat be carried.</p> <p>C +[N](D) Journeys originating/terminating in Tonga, Independant Samoa and Vanuatu: Air Pacific reserves the right to refuse baggage exceeding the free baggage allowance as specified in Rule 114.</p>
