RULE	SECTION I - GENERAL RULES
97	<p><u>ACCEPTANCE OF BAGGAGE</u></p> <p>(A) <u>GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE</u> Carrier will accept for transportation as baggage, such personal property as is necessary or appropriate for the wear, use, comfort, or convenience of the passenger for the purpose of the trip, subject to the following conditions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) All baggage is subject to inspection by the carrier; however, the carrier shall not be obligated to perform inspection. Carrier will refuse to transport or will remove at any point baggage that the passenger refuses to submit for inspection.</li> <li>(2) Carrier has the right to refuse to transport baggage on any flight other than the one carrying the passenger.</li> <li>(3) Carrier will refuse to accept property for transportation that is not suitably packaged to withstand ordinary handling; whose size, weight or character renders it unsuitable for transportation on the particular aircraft that is to transport it; that will damage other baggage; that cannot be accommodated without harming or annoying passengers.</li> <li>(4) Checked baggage will be carried in the same aircraft as the passenger unless such carriage is deemed impractical by carrier, in which event carrier will carry the baggage on the next preceding or subsequent flight on which space is available.</li> <li>(5) Upon delivery to carrier of the baggage to be checked, carrier will insert in the ticket the number of pieces and weight of the checked baggage (which act shall constitute the issuance of the baggage check); in addition Carrier will issue for identification purposes only, a baggage (claim) tag for each piece of baggage so delivered and covered by the baggage check. Money, jewelry, silverware, negotiable papers, securities or other valuables will not be accepted as checked baggage. Fragile and perishable items will be accepted in accordance with the provisions of Rule 100. Carrier will not accept explosives, corrosives and articles easily ignited for carriage as baggage.</li> </ol> <p>C +[N](6) Journeys originating/terminating in Tonga, Independent Samoa and Vanuatu: Air Pacific reserves the right to refuse baggage exceeding the free baggage allowance as specified in Rule 114.</p> <p>(B) <u>QUANTITY AND/OR SIZE MAXIMUMS</u> No article will be accepted for transportation if the maximum outside linear dimensions exceed 80 inches or if the article weighs more than 70 lbs.</p> <p>(C) <u>ACCEPTANCE OF SPECIAL ITEMS AND PETS</u> Special items and pets will only be accepted in accordance with the additional provisions and/or charges specified in Rule 100 (CONDITIONS FOR ACCEPTANCE OF SPECIAL ITEMS).</p>
